

Personality Types



Personality refers to a distinctive set of enduring psychological traits, behavioural patterns, thoughts, and emotions that differentiate one individual from another. It encapsulates the consistent and relatively stable ways in which people think, feel, and behave across various situations and over time. Personality is the essence of an individual's psychological makeup, shaping how they interact with the world.

This serves as a guideline; all personalities grow up and develop in diverse environments that also shape them, but the fundamental foundations remain the same.

Through our experiences, we've observed that individuals with different eye colours tend to exhibit similar characteristics and share a common outlook on life.

This stomach area is encircled by a line known as the 'nerve wreath,' symbolizing the colon and simultaneously the nervous system. This clear line becomes instrumental in analysing the Time-Line, as every experienced trauma manifests as a sign along this line.

Similar traumas leave similar shapes, visible in both eyes. The left eye signifies the age from conception to 60, while the right eye reflects traumas from age 61 to 120. It resembles an ECG report with various shapes of spikes, some sharp and sudden, others stretching over a more extended period.

A clear 'time-line' or 'nerve wreath' in the eye signifies a 'Pit-Bull' personality. Conversely, the absence of a line, usually in dark eyes, indicates a "Labrador" personality.

Green eyes, a combination of blue and brown, often result from one parent having blue eyes and the other brown eyes, akin to mixing paint; blue and red create green.

Pit-Bull Personality:

Individuals with a 'Pit-Bull' personality are typically direct, straightforward, and organized. They are the no-nonsense type, and interactions with them are transparent. This personality eschews 'small talk' and tends to be highly analytical. They can efficiently tackle tasks, either independently or through delegation.

This personality thrives on facts and is indifferent to others' opinions as long as goals are achieved. The "Pitbull" may appear cold and unemotional, but they are continually processing thoughts internally.

A recent discovery within this personality type is the "Sigma personality." Although both "Alpha" and "Sigma" personalities fall under the 'Pitbull' category, distinctions exist. The "Alpha male" is more assertive and social, while the "Sigma male" is reserved, observant, and follows a different set of rules. The same applies to females with these variances, maintaining femininity but sharing the determination of a "Pit-Bull" man.

"Pitbull" women often exhibit a neat dressing style, minimal jewellery, and makeup that emphasizes quality and simplicity. They opt for practicality in clothing, often choosing identical or similar items for convenience.

Their living spaces also reflect simplicity, devoid of excess. They avoid clutter and have minimalistic, well-organized cupboards. In health matters, the Pitbull makes a cooperative patient, making informed decisions and following advice.

A Pitbull rarely shows significant stress lines in the iris, usually having one or two stress lines compared to other personality types. They approach problems analytically, finding solutions without succumbing to emotional distress.

In a professional context, Pitbulls excel in management roles that require organization but may struggle in marketing due to their aversion to 'small talk.' Emotional individuals and a disorganized environment can drain their energy and induce stress.

Labrador Personality:

The Labrador personality, usually found in brown eyes, lacks a visible 'nerve wreath' or 'time-line.' Although challenging to discern, trained iridologists can faintly observe the outline and identify traumas.

This personality type is characteristic of a gentle individual, emotionally attuned and easily moved. Labradors are empathetic listeners, appearing calm outwardly while harbouring inner emotional conflicts and stress.

Labradors pay meticulous attention to dressing, emphasizing details. They align with the kinaesthetic personality in NLP, often looking down to the right during conversations to express stored emotions or turning their eyes downwards to the right when recalling past or future events.

In relationships, two Labrador personalities may complement each other. However, a female Labrador may prefer a stronger partner, and if she chooses a dominant Pitbull partner, the differences in pace and level of detail may lead to frustration.

Combination Personalities:

Individuals with green eyes, a blend of blue and brown, exhibit traits of both Pitbull and Labrador personalities. The visibility of the 'nerve wreath' determines the percentage of each personality in the combination.

These combination personalities face challenges in decision-making due to the conflict between their two dominant personalities. Choosing clothing becomes a complex task, influenced by the dominant personality at a given moment.

In relationships, the dynamics are intricate. A female with green eyes may fare better with a Pitbull male, finding a Labrador too gentle. Conversely, a male with a combination personality may struggle in a relationship with a Pitbull female, opting for compatibility with a Labrador.

Healers working with combination personalities face difficulties, as the Labrador part may adopt a victim mentality, while the Pitbull part seeks change. Cooperation is attainable through explaining the root causes of difficulties.

In the business realm, combination personalities excel due to their ability to 'wear both hats,' showcasing versatility.
